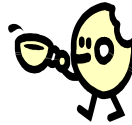
TIME TO GET FIRED UP!

In this workshop we shall seek answers to two questions. First, if God is the giver of life (Exodus 3:1-15) and “Our Father” (Matthew 6:9-13), what’s the relationship between God and our hardships?
