These retreats are similar to the Cursillo Retreat and are called Kairos Retreats (Kairos is a Greek word for time). We also deliver a package of two or three cookies, together with a prayer, to each of the twelve hundred inmates in the prison's general population. The cookies will be picked up at the Church Office on **Wednesday, April 16, 2008 at 5 PM**. If you are able to contribute to this effort, please put your cookies in one quart freezer bags. **The freezer bags are a new requirement.** This is being done so that the prison officials can look and see the bag contents without opening each bag. Please bring your family's cookie bags to the Church Office at the Family Life Center before 5 PM on Wednesday the 16th. We thank you for sharing. We would also like to invite any men in the parish who have done the Cursillo Retreat to consider joining us in this ministry. What is Cursillo? Thanks for asking, please join us in the Church Narthex after the 7:30 AM Mass on Monday mornings. We have a weekly Cursillo Prayer Reunion each Monday morning.

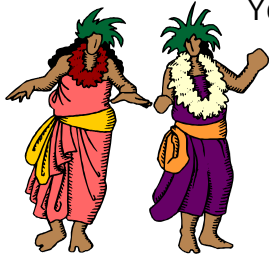
